

## Pupil Premium Expenditure: 2018-2019

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is money allocated to our school for disadvantaged pupils (PP pupils) in order to raise their attainment.

### Nature of support - Targeted support 2018/2019 *(calculated proportionally)*

- Quality first teaching –Focus on features of outstanding lessons, lesson observations, learning walks, work scrutiny, pupil progress meetings, purchase resources such as iPads. Detailed provision maps. Structured professional development programme for TAs to increase effectiveness of intervention programmes. Release PP leader in school to monitor and evaluate the progress of disadvantaged pupils.
- Employ an additional teacher to reduce teacher: pupil ratio
- Intervention programmes implemented. Teaching assistants employed (for example to deliver specific programmes to support small groups of PP /individual PP children in class) and provide social and emotional support
- Additional TA hours in Years1, 2 and 6 to improve attainment.

### Nature of support - Enriching the curriculum 2018/19 *(calculated proportionally)*

- ICT expertise: An ICT technician (teaching assistant) is employed to work with PP pupils.
- Subsidised day visits: For example to Young Voices at the Sheffield Arena, Crucial Crew with South Yorkshire Police, museums such as National Coal Mining Museum and visits to wetland centres and stately homes such as Chatsworth House in Derbyshire.
- Subsidise residential visits to London and Whitby/Scarborough.
- Employ music specialist.
- Employ team coach for PP pupils in team sports events.
- Employ a Lunchtime Playground Assistant to organise activities at lunchtime in the playground.

### Nature of support - Extended school support 2018/2019 *(calculated proportionally)*

- Workshops (eg Parent workshops for reading).Supply cover for teachers involved.
- Breakfast items/milk

## Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact of our spending by regularly measuring the progress made by each PP pupil and ensure that he/she is on track to achieve /exceed their yearly/end of KS1 or 2 targets. Assessment data will also be used to evaluate the impact of any intervention programme. However, evaluation will focus not only on academic gains but also on how pupils' self-confidence/ esteem have developed as a consequence of the intervention and how their access to the curriculum has improved.
