

## Pupil Premium 2017-2018

The Foxwood Academy allocation of Pupil Premium funding for 2017-2018 was just under £60,000. This was used to support the 51 children eligible in the following ways:

<b>Promotion and Raising Awareness</b> of Pupil Premium and Pupil Premium Plus	£200	Greater understanding of PP(P) amongst parents and carers. Additional PP(P) students on roll @ £1900 per pupil per year – Increased income to Academy of £4,466 from 2016-2017.
<b>Curriculum Resourcing</b> Literacy	£1,349.32	86% targeted students achieved outcomes in English and 100% in Reading in line with PMG.
<b>Curriculum Resourcing</b> Numeracy	£1,084.33	100% (up 19% on 2016-2017) targeted students achieved outcomes in Maths in line with PMG.
<b>Curriculum Resourcing</b> Creative	£254.99	Increased engagement in learning through music. Students confident, skilled and proud to be performing at our Annual Presentation Evening. Online teacher resources and Schemes of Work in place to engage, challenge and develop creativity.
<b>Curriculum Resourcing</b> Sensory	£1,115.58	Improved levels of concentration and engagement. Access to appropriate sensory curriculum, sensory stories and sensory play opportunities.
<b>Curriculum</b> Computing	£1,680	Required qualifications achieved to access Further Education.
<b>Curriculum</b> New PfA Community	£1,435	Demonstrate good table manners, social skills and etiquette at meal times. Access and participation in Community visits to develop self-awareness, self-confidence and self-esteem.
<b>Curriculum</b> New PfA Independence	£582	Independent living skills developed – preparing simple meals. Eating, drinking and related social skills developed using adapted cutlery/crockery. Independent travel and timekeeping.
<b>Curriculum</b> New PfA Employment	£1,585.39	Essential PPE for the workplace to ensure Health and Safety rules are followed. Appropriate clothing for the workplace/interviews to enable success. Workers appropriately trained and supervised.
<b>Curriculum</b> New PfA Health	£1,095	Provide opportunity to become involved in physical activity. Engaged and practicing physical activity within a social group. Health improved. Increase in positive mental health and well-being; reduced anxiety for students and their families.
<b>Curriculum</b> Enrichment	£2,680.19	Enjoyment, improved co-ordination, balance and muscle tone, feeling of independence, self-achievement and self-confidence. Improved physical and social skills. High quality experiences, including residential visits, accessible to all students.
<b>Curriculum Subscriptions</b> Busy Things – Licence	£518	Curriculum enhanced with high quality resources to ensure Teaching and Learning experience is maximised.

<b>Positive Behaviour</b> Social Emotional Skills	£324.15	Supported to express thoughts in a safe way. 100% reduction in negative behaviours from Autumn 2017 to Spring to Summer term 2018.
Peripatetic <b>music lessons</b>	£2,100	Pupils enjoy and achieve in music. 85% of students met over 80% of their specific music targets with 54% meeting 100%.
<b>Uniform</b>	£591.89	Individuals feel part of the Academy and 'fit-in' with their peer group, the majority of whom wear uniform. Increased confidence and self-esteem. Sense of belonging for individuals within the Academy.
Hot <b>school dinner</b> daily	£1,649.40	Increased concentration and engagement in lessons throughout the day.
<b>Parental Support</b> Transport	£354.86	Transport offered to parents to enable them to come in to the school to meet staff and support their Son/Daughter at a range of events. Transport to attend college open days and 1:1 interviews.
<b>Staffing</b> Family Liaison and Attendance Officer	£18,393.56	Support for parents and families in place where relationships between home and school are now strong. Increased parental attendance at a range of Academy meetings, for example student's medicals and review meetings. Support to transport students home safely if they become ill during the day. Appropriate full training in Safeguarding, CAF and Child protection.
<b>Staffing</b> Intervention Strategy – Phase Leaders	£17,653.47	Barriers identified and intervention in place for individual students across all 3 phases to ensure successful outcomes in Attendance, Behaviour and Learning.
<b>Staffing</b> Independent Travel Training	£160	1:1 independent travel to and from school for targeted individuals.
<b>Staffing</b> After School Clubs	£126	Opportunities from all students to access appropriate and targeted after school clubs, regardless of where they live. Safe travel home.
<b>Staffing</b> Access to Professionals OT, SaLT	£4,500	Expertise from outside the immediate school community to support families and pupils in the home and the Academy. Increased skills and understanding of how to support children.
<b>Staffing</b> CAF / CAMHS /CASY Referrals	£250	Access to specialist services increased in 2017-2018 to counsellors.
