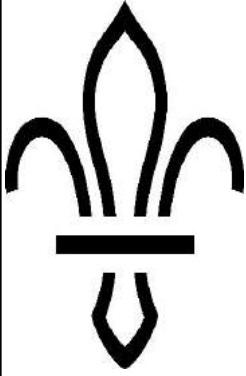

The closing date for posting is Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> December. They will then be collected, taken to a central distribution point and the local Scouts in each area will deliver the cards the following week.
