## Next Week in English

### Year 3

In English next week, Year 3 will be reading our new text. We will be focusing on comprehension strategies and analysing authorial techniques.

### Year 4

Next week, Year 4 will be reading as a writer and then moving on to innovating the story 'The Canal'. The children will be looking at the features of the given text to create a toolkit. They will then be creating their own characters and setting for a warning story. We will be learning how to punctuate speech correctly to use within our stories.

### Year 5

This week in year 5 we will be continuing to explore different forms of poetry.

### Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be writing their own version of a survival text. In class, the children will be creating their own plan and text, which will be different from the one we have been studying. They will effectively use modal verbs, colons and subheadings to structure their writing.

## Next Week in Maths

### Year 3

Next week in maths, we will be continuing to learn and practise mental strategies for subtraction including selecting the most appropriate method.

### Year 4

Next week in Year 4, we will be counting in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 100. We will be applying our knowledge of multiples through problem solving and a wide variety of contexts.

### Year 5

Next week, we will be consolidating what we have learnt over the past few weeks to solve number and practical problems that involve place value and knowledge of factors and multiples.

### Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will continue to use equivalences between simple fractions, decimals and percentages. Year 6 will also use common factors to simplify fractions.
