### Planned spending of School Sports Money 2018 – 19

Remit
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We are in receipt of £16,675 for schools sports.</li> <li>We are committed to the physical and mental well-being of our children.</li> <li><u>Key indicator 1</u> – daily physical activity. We will upgrade our outdoor space and invest in equipment and experiences that allow our children a greater range of activities at playtimes. We will look at how to make our lessons more active so that they are accessible by all learning types.</li> <li><u>Key indicator 2</u> – the profile of sport is high across school. We have a professional PE coach for our extra-curricular football club. We offer subsidised after school clubs. We encourage participation in inter school challenges. Our resources are to be audited this year and tough long lasting equipment to be ordered. We propose to have dedicated days allocated to certain aspects of health and to buy in expertise for this. We anticipate Box2BFit amongst others this coming year.</li> <li><u>Key indicator 3</u> – Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff. We are investing in weekly training for our NQT in all aspects of the PE curriculum. Cricket Asylum are coming in to train our staff on summer sports activities. TAs will lead swimming support.</li> <li><u>Key indicator 4</u> – A wide range of sports and activities offered for children. Our PE coverage is wide and exciting for our children. We have a number of clubs that are suitable for all ages. Building on the playground activity sessions that we had in last year our instructor will run playtime workshops for Year 5 children to lead activities with children in the playground.</li> <li><u>Key indicator 5</u> – Increased participation in competitive sport. We are signed up to the local cluster network for sports and have a commitment to attending the events. We will subsidise after school clubs to open them up to a wider range of children and introduce new sporting experiences for our children.</li> </ul>
Proposed expenditure
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>£1950 for CPD and curriculum delivery support – this funding will secure the joint employment of a school sport’s co-ordinator via the cluster. This will be known as HX7 sports.</li> <li>£475 - Tagtiv8 experience day for physical learning</li> <li>£462 - cricket asylum training for staff and children autumn term</li> <li>£3240 – British values and high school readiness sessions including extra-curricular club</li> <li>£5,850 for professional sports lessons, playtime games training and extra-curricular clubs, including NQT training for 10 weeks.</li> <li>£500 to help with transport costs – hiring of mini buses if needed – to attend competitions and events</li> <li>£2500 for new equipment as a result of the audit including Maypole @ £346.50</li> <li>Wellbeing coaching £1000 as required for positive mental attitude to challenge and fitness</li> <li>Experience days – Box2BFit and Health and Wellbeing week using the rest of the grant .</li> </ul> <p><b>= £15,977</b></p>

### **Expected impact of expenditure**

- Due to updated CPD confidence in teaching aspects of PE to increase and provision to be never less than good.
- Class based lessons to demonstrate an element of physicality when and where appropriate in order to fulfil recommendations from Chief Medical Officer.
- After school clubs to be well attended by children across all ages and abilities – all places taken.
- Inter – school competitions to be attended and children to report enjoyment of them.
- A greater range of playtime activities undertaken, leadership opportunities for Year 5 and greater satisfaction with playtimes from pupils.
- Nearly sporty kids to be further enthused to continue with sport as a matter of choice.
- Pupils to understand the importance of a healthy diet and the impact of exercise upon their bodies and development.
- Children with specific needs regarding esteem, anxiety & general well-being to be provided with the professional help once school based options are exhausted.
