Next Week in English

Year 3

In English, we are beginning to write our own portal stories focusing on setting descriptions. We will be concentrating on using powerful adjectives and verbs and using figurative language to create atmosphere.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning how to write an effective opening and ending. We will then be entering the invention stage of our writing. We will learn how to write our own story but will change the focus from the original text.

Year 5

This week, Year 5 have created some wonderful poems that are now on display around the school. Next week, we will be learning a new text and discussing the features of it.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be writing an explanation text about burying a pharaoh. In class, the children will be creating their own plan and text, which will be written independently in their portfolios at the end of the week. They will effectively use modal verbs, colons and subheadings to structure their writing.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

In maths next week we will be learning to use the inverse to complete calculations including missing number problems.

Year 4

Next week we will be adding and subtracting mentally with increasingly larger numbers. We will look at methods such as using place value, regrouping, equal sum and equal difference. We will learn to select an appropriate strategy and use rounding to estimate and check our answer.

Year 5

In Year 4 next week, we will be identifying links between multiplication and division and exploring this through a variety of problems.

Year 6

Next week in maths, Year 6 will compare and order fractions. This includes performing mental calculations, including operations and large numbers. Year 6 will use common factors to simplify fractions and use common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination.
