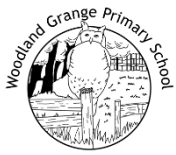


## Woodland Grange Primary School - Year 3 Curriculum

<b>Main theme/topic</b>	The Tudors	Journey to the Centre of the Earth (including volcanoes, rocks & minerals)	World War 2 (including Beaumanor Hall residential)
<b>Literacy – focus/texts</b>	During the key stage children will write using a range of text types including: information, instructions, reports/recounts, traditional tales, stories from other cultures and fictional narrative text. There is an additional focus on grammar, punctuation and phonics/spelling.

<b>Maths</b>	There is a 'quick maths'/mental arithmetic focus throughout the year. Times tables (and derived division facts) are also taught throughout key stage 2. Work on the 4 operations as well as key number facts are areas in which all year groups place greater emphasis. In subject areas like maths the topics may need to be flexible to accurately reflect the learning needs of the children. The following is to be viewed as a <b>guide</b> only.
