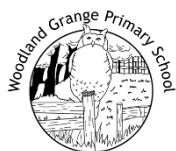


## Woodland Grange Primary School - Year 6 Curriculum

<b>Main theme/topic</b>	Victorians & the Industrial Revolution		Suspense!
<b>Literacy – focus/texts</b>	During the key stage children will write using a range of text types including: information, instructions, reports/recounts, traditional tales, stories from other cultures and fictional narrative text. During year 6 there is also a revision of all text types & their features in preparation for the end of key stage 2. There is also additional emphasis on all areas of grammar, punctuation & spelling.

<b>Maths</b>	There is a 'quick maths'/mental arithmetic focus throughout the year. Times tables (and derived division facts) are also taught throughout key stage 2. Work on the 4 operations as well as key number facts are areas in which all year groups place greater emphasis. In subject areas like maths the topics may need to be flexible to accurately reflect the learning needs of the children (e.g. covering elements of decimals as part of place value). The following is to be viewed as a <b>guide</b> only. <b>Throughout year 6 there is additional emphasis placed on equipping the children ready for their end of key stage assessments.</b>

Explore features of video editing or animation package. Film, create & edit. Program using visual & text-based language (e.g. BBC microbit) as well as basics in HTML.
