Punctuality

We try to encourage children to improve their punctuality - an essential and important life skill. Our school bell is rung at 8:45am, marking the start of the school day. The children then line up on the playground where they are collected by their Class Teacher. If a child arrives at school after the last child is in the building and the door is shut, they are recorded as being late. There is a window of approximately 5 minutes from the start of the school day to when your child would be recorded as late.
