Parent Questionnaire Autumn 2018 Feedback

Thank you for the replies and the comments that were added on some of the questionnaires. All the information will be used to support the development of our school community. Out of 368 pupils, 216 Parents took part in the questionnaire. All figures are rounded for the ease of understanding.

Wellbeing and Safety

98% of parents feel that their child is happy at school. This is a slight improvement from last year's questionnaire.

99% of parents feel that their child is safe when at school. This is supported by the fact that 91% of parents feel that most children behave well at school and 90% feel that their child is not bullied at school.

Teaching and Learning

97% of parents feel that their child is making good progress at school and 98% felt that teaching was good at the school. 94% feel that the school gives information about events and activities that are happening in school. However, 14% of parents felt that we do not share enough information about how children are getting on in school. Although 92% of parents do feel it is easy to contact their child's teacher if they need to.

Behaviour

91% of parents feel that most children behave well and 98% of parents feel that we encourage the children to work hard and be independent. 90% feel that their child is not bullied.

Leadership and Management

91% of parents feel that the school is well lead and well managed. However, only 83% of parents feel that we take in to account parents' views, suggestions and concerns. During the questionnaire we asked for suggestions for workshops and support we could offer you as parents. Thank you for all your suggestions.

Conclusion

With regard to Workshops, you felt that these would be required especially for phonics and to help you understand the new approach to maths so you can support your children. It has also been noted that you would like some opportunities to come in to school to see how the children are getting on in these lessons. A phonics workshop has already been planned and a chance for FS parents to come and see phonics in action is already in the diary.

Homework is always a thorny issue and getting the right amount to please all of the people all of the time' is always going to be difficult. However, as a starting point, we will clarify our expectations especially now we have the online Mathematics, Spellodrome and Times Tables Rock Stars for the children to do.

We have taken on board that you want further information regarding the progress your child(ren) are making in school. The senior leadership are going to look at this to ensure that we can provide you with the information you need without it taking too much away from the valuable planning and assessment time of the teachers.
