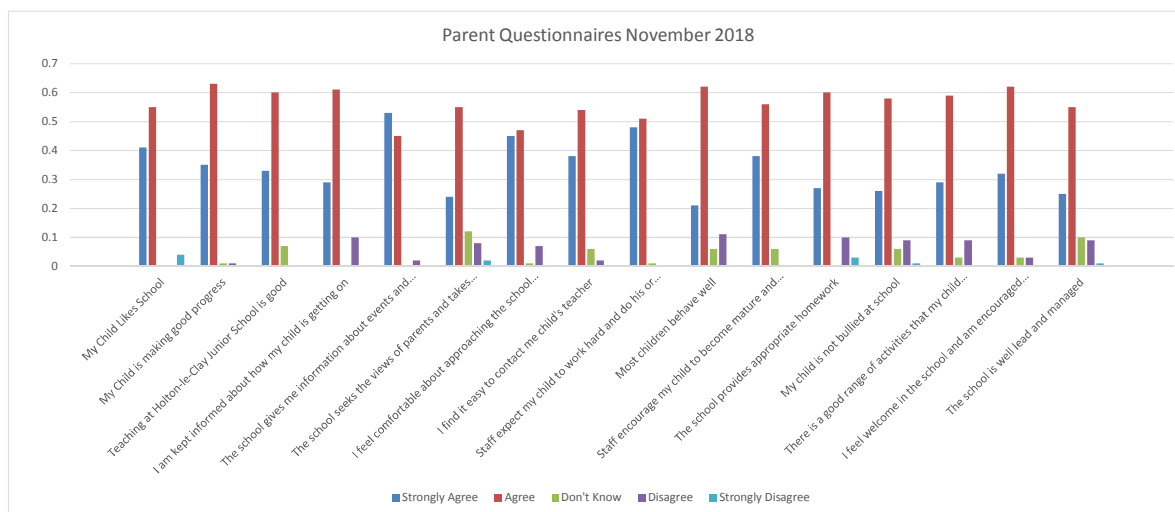

What would you like us to do better at Holton-le Clay Junior School?

No concerns but as a suggestion: some emphasis on learning techniques such as relaxation and mindfulness (it would be lovely to see a 5 minute exercise daily). Although I was impressed with the introduction of yoga.
 After school clubs. More and varied would be great.
 More school trips
 Easy contact with teachers. More availability for parents evening for working parents. More chance to see pupils work.
 The school could benefit from clearer leadership and improved management
 I am happy with all areas of the school at the moment. No changes needed. Just keep building on what you are currently doing as I believe this will have a positive impact on all pupils.
 More choice of after school clubs or even before school clubs as most schools have them now
 Less dressing up days. Puts an unnecessary burden on parents to provide outfits.
 Less homework, homework every night is too much and becomes a chore for the whole family.
 More visible staff as children leave school at 3.30. It concerns me that children fly out of the gate and also that many parents still ignore the yellow zigzags. Perhaps a member of staff standing outside would remind children and parents about safety outside school.
 A different way of voting (council/mini police). Children voting for children of this age will always be based on popularity.
