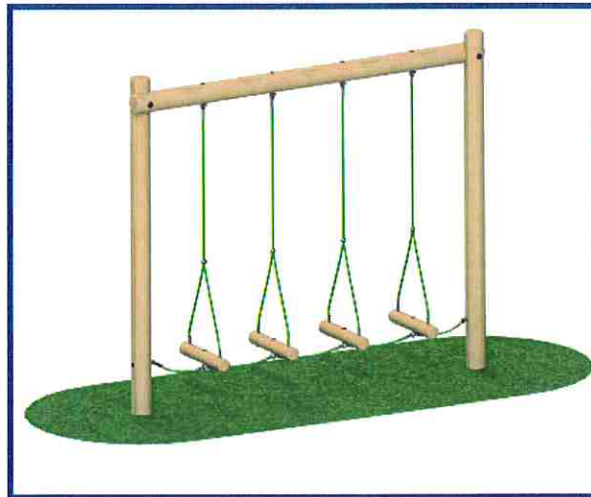


Trim Trail Update

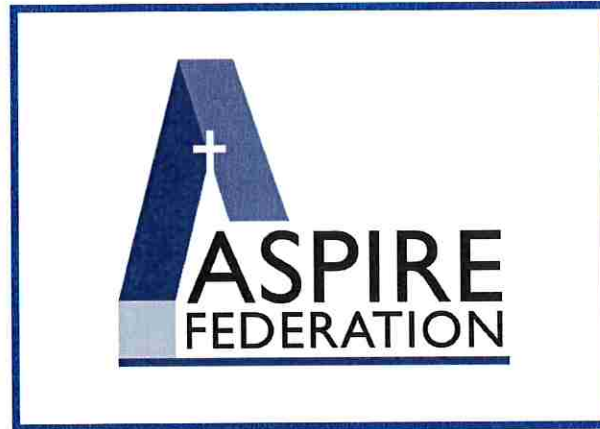

Aspire Federation Update

Thank you to all who completed our Federation survey. It provided us with useful insights into those aspects of 'federation' which are either well comprehended or barely understood by parents and carers. In stating this, the range of understanding is just as apparent amongst teachers, school governors and Joe Public in general.

We shall be holding parents'/carers' meetings in the New Year when we shall endeavour to answer any questions or address any concerns you might have should we decide to federate further with the Saxonbury schools.

In the meantime, I thought it might be instructive to cover some of the survey responses, a few each week, through the Newsletters. I shall start next week with the reasons for choosing to federate, followed in the second week by a clarification of the role of the Executive Head Teacher. In the third edition, there will be a short piece on changing governance and the need for a more strategic perspective, then, in week four, an assessment of the impact of federating on all the stakeholders associated with our schools.

Finally, I would like to point out that one of the unexpected outcomes of the Aspire and Saxonbury surveys was how similar the responses were; in terms of statistical significance they could have come from the same group.
