Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week in English, we will be writing our own independent portal stories, focusing on creating interesting setting descriptions and atmosphere.

Year 4

Year 4 will be continuing to learn how to write an effective openers and endings and will then be entering the invention stage of our writing. We will be learning how to write our own story that has a different focus to the text we have learnt.

Year 5

This week in Year 5, we have been looking at discussions and debates to identify both sides of a topic. We are going to continue with analysing the text next week, before looking at planning and starting to write our own discussion text.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be looking at a poem called 'The Sorting Hat'. We will be learning the story map for the poem, performing the poem in groups as well as identifying the features that the poet has used. At the end of the week, the classes will be writing their own versions.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week in maths, we will be using what we have learnt in addition and subtraction to solve problems, including missing number problems. We will be particularly looking at creating fact families, part whole models and using the inverse.

Year 4

Next week in maths, we will be recognising and using factor pairs, then solving problems including multiplication, addition and subtraction.

Year 5

Next week, we will be adding and subtracting whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions.
