Under the Equality Act 2010, which consolidates and strengthens previous equality legislation, we have a duty to eliminate discrimination, harassment or victimisation against pupils because of their personal characteristics or background, to promote equality of opportunity between everyone in the school, and to foster good relations between the different groups among our pupils.

Information about our school

To help us meet our duties under the Act and ensure that we do not disadvantage anyone in our school, we are publishing information about our school population, which we will update each year.

- We have 217 pupils, with numbers stabilising.
- 22% of our pupils have Special Educational Needs (SEN), and receive additional support to help their progress. The SENCo has a duty to ensure that these children have successful outcomes, with progress that is in line with their peers.
- We have some pupils with physical disabilities, and we have carried out adaptation of the school premises as necessary to ensure that they can access all our facilities.
- 43 of our pupils are entitled to support from Pupil Premium Grant.
- The school has a fairly even split of boys and girls. There are 100 boys and 107 girls. The progress and attainment of each gender is valued equally and any trends relating to gender are tackled rigorously through appropriate interventions.

We ensure that all policies covering different areas such as anti-bullying, support the school's equality aims. Jennifer Evans (Headteacher) has staff responsibility for equalities, and Sian Evans is the Governor who has responsibility for overseeing equality issues.
