- To develop a consistent approach to lessons.
- To increase the confidence and competence of staff.
- To enhanced our inclusive curriculum.
- To improved pupil attitudes towards PE.
- To ensure an increase in confidence and competence of pupils.
- To achieve an increase in the proportion of children achieving age related expectations in PE.
- To enhanced our extra-curricular provision.
- To encourage an increase in pupil participation in school teams and sport opportunities in the community.
- To ensure an exposure to high quality specialist coaches.
- To increase links within our local community by forming official partnerships.

## Impact of PE and Sport Premium 2017-2018

Following a 58% increase in 2015-16, parents reported further new uptake in 5 sports. Building on the success of the previous year, 22% of all respondents noted new uptake in sport, particularly football, swimming and dance.

Fairfield School is now an official partner of Manchester City Football Club.

Children in Years 1 to 6 had access to coaching in 15 different sports during 2017/2018.

## Swimming

perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations	76%

Although Sports Premium is not used those not achieving the 25 metres swimming objective, have the opportunity to repeat the intensive 2 week swimming programme.
