Our spelling patterns for this week are:

Alternatives for the phoneme /l/ on the end of words

It would be helpful if your child could learn the following spellings containing the ending:

ll	-l	le
bell	tail	candle
doll	goal	handle
fill	girl	middle
dull	real	bubble
ball	curl	simple
roll	sail	circle
chill	foil	triangle
still	peel	jungle

Helpful hints!

- ll usually follows a short vowel sound
- l usually follows a vowel digraph
- -le is by far the most common way to make the /l/ sound on the end of 2-syllable words, and if children are unsure of how to spell a word, this is the 'best guess'

Common words for this week:

early, most, only, both
