## Next Week in English

### Year 3

Next week in English, Year 3 will be learning to write instructions for making our own drinks based on the smoothie recipe we made this week. We will focus on imperative verbs and using time adverbials to order our instructions.

### Year 4

In Year 4 next week, we will continue to learn how to articulate and justify answers, arguments and opinions. We are innovating a discussion text and will then move on to inventing our own.

### Year 5

Next week, Year 5 they will be writing their own discussion texts using the stimulus of a book to generate opposing sides of the discussion.

### Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will be continuing to learn 'Harry faces the Basilisk.' The classes will be boxing up and creating their own versions of the text. Shared writing will be the main focus as we look to create a high level piece of writing. We will be looking at including speech, a range of punctuation, sentence types and figurative language.

## Next Week in Maths

### Year 3

In maths, Year 3 will be continuing to learn the column method for addition including regrouping. We will then begin to learn to use the column method to subtract.

### Year 4

Next week in maths, Year 4 will be continuing their work on problem solving involving measure and then move on to multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000.

### Year 5

Next week, we shall be completing our work on column addition and subtraction, and start revisiting formal methods for multiplication.

### Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will look at the relationship between fractions and decimals. This will include associating fractions with division and looking at decimals and fractions equivalents.
