Phonics Workshop

Mrs Oliver, Mrs Britton and Miss Rudkin delivered an interesting and informative workshop on our approach to phonics in Foundation Stage and how parents can help.

The most important way in which any parent can help their child with reading is to read regularly and often to them. Short stories, longer ones read over a few nights, and poems if time is short, are all great ways to read. It encourages children to see you as a reader and it is also a fantastic way to help children understand the joy of reading.

If children already see the joy in reading it will help them to be interested in the process of learning the phonic sounds.
