



Carlton Miniott C.P. School –Physical Education Report 2018

As a school we identified the following areas to continue to drive Physical activity forward within our school.

- Improve the basic knowledge of teaching Games skills to specific staff to improve the consistency of Games teaching across each school.
- To work with the lower ability target groups to increase their skills and knowledge.
- Develop a festival to celebrate the achievements of the middle ability children.
- Develop a programme of events for the most able children across our schools.

What we did

1. Improve the basic knowledge of teaching Games skills to specific staff to improve the consistency of Games teaching across each school.

Rebecca Clay PE specialist planned and delivered three Games specific CPD sessions after school to staff looking at striking and fielding, invasion and net wall games. Staff were given practical idea to use with classes for both Key stage 1 and key stage 2.

Duncan Burgess also worked with classes to deliver Rugby Sessions with Key stage 2 and James Lofthouse from the FA worked with Year 1 and 2 to upskill staff in invasion games based around football.

2. To work with the lower ability 'target' groups to increase their skills and knowledge.

Within school the PE specialist continues to work with pupils requiring additional support with any aspect of Physical Education: Target pupils for Physical Education have been identified from last years' PE teacher assessments/ observations. The PE specialist has discussed target pupils with staff in year groups 1 to 4 and has worked with these pupils on a weekly rota. Individual goals and targets were discussed and recorded, and pupils' progress tracked within their PE lessons. These PE 'interventions' have increased the confidence of students who have previously lacked enthusiasm for sport and physical activity. They have gone on to join school teams and participate in competitions representing school which is a fantastic achievement.

3. Develop a festival to celebrate the achievements of the middle ability children.

All children at Carlton Miniott Academy have had the opportunity to compete against children from other schools throughout the year, in both Key stage one and two.

This year the children were offered further festivals as specific groups were targeted for additional events. We sent 'B' teams to Thirsk area competitions for Sports Hall athletics, Tag Rugby and Quick Sticks Hockey and added an additional athletics event to our competition calendar for children in Year 3/4 to build confidence in competing in sport.



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4. Develop a programme of events for the most able children across our schools.

The PE specialist also introduced the PE academy this term to further raise the profile of PE and sport within our cluster of schools. The academy, aimed at pupils achieving highly in Physical Education and Sport, offers the opportunity not only for these pupils to play sport together, but challenges them to push themselves socially to overcome barriers. Pupils are encouraged to celebrate their achievements at each academy meeting – Learn new skills for the next session and actively seek out new friendships with pupils from other schools.

School Competitions and Clubs – Sainsbury’s School Games

We have had another successful Year of after school clubs with all staff offering support to extra-curricular activities and many children attending.
