- What do Christians believe about a good life?

In maths I will be focusing on

- Being able to recall and use the multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.
- Becoming secure with using mental methods for solving multiplication and division problems (using known facts).
- Starting to use written methods for multiplication and division calculations.
- Practising estimating periods of time.
- Reading the time on analogue clocks, including those with roman numerals, with increasing accuracy, to the nearest minute.
- Making, recognising and describing 3D shapes.

In English I will be focusing on

- Continuing to look at grammatical features such as subordination, coordination, tense and punctuation including apostrophes and speech marks.
- Revising prefixes.
- Exploring themes within texts and becoming able to explain the messages in a narrative to other people.
- Developing my understanding of settings.
- Exploring elements of and writing our own Greek myth
