## SPORTS FUNDING FOR PRIMARY AGED PUPILS

REPORT TO GOVERNORS 2018-2019

### VISION FOR THE PRIMARY PE & SPORT PREMIUM

**ALL PUPILS** leaving primary school **PHYSICALLY LITERATE** & with the **KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS & MOTIVATION** necessary to equip them for a **HEALTHY, ACTIVE LIFESTYLE & LIFELONG PARTICIPATION** in physical activity & sport

**WHAT IS THE PE & SPORT PREMIUM?** The PE & sport premium is a government funding stream designed to help primary schools improve the quality of PE & sport activities they offer. Schools receive PE & sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6.

**WHO RECEIVES THE FUNDING & HOW MUCH IS IT?** Most schools with primary-age pupils receive the PE & sport premium. This includes maintained schools & academies, special schools & non-maintained special schools, & pupil referral units (PRUs). Nursery schools & independent schools (other than non-maintained special schools) do not receive the funding. In 2017-2018, schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils will receive £1,000 per pupil, while schools with 17 or more eligible pupils will receive £16,000 & an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

**USING THE PE & SPORT PREMIUM:** Schools must use the funding to make additional & sustainable improvements to the quality of PE & sport they offer. This means that you should use the premium to develop or add to the PE & sport activities that the school already offers, or make improvements that will benefit future pupils. For example, you can use your funding to hire qualified sports coaches to work alongside teachers, or to support less active children by running or extending school clubs. Funding should not be used to cover core functions, such as teachers' planning & preparation time, or to teach the minimum requirements of the National Curriculum.

The Governing Body of the Huntspill Federation will use the PE & sport Premium Grant to achieve the following **OBJECTIVE**:

The Governing Body of the Huntspill Federation want to see **self-sustaining improvement** in the quality of PE & sport in our two primary schools. They intend that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (*above*) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE & Sport Premium funding.

**Governors wish to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:**

- i. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - minimum of 30 minutes per day
- ii. the profile of PE & sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- iii. increased confidence, knowledge & skills of all staff in teaching PE & sport
- iv. broader experience of a range of sports & activities offered to all pupils
- v. increased participation in competitive sport

Under the **Ofsted Schools Inspection Framework**, inspectors will assess how effectively leaders use the Primary PE & Sport Premium & measure its impact on outcomes for pupils, & how effectively governors hold them to account for this.

The Huntspill Federation will publish details, through this report, of how they spend this funding & the effect it has had on pupils' PE & sport participation and attainment.



The Governors of The Huntspill Federation have agreed that the money must be used so that all pupils benefit regardless of sporting ability by:

- having access to specialist PE teaching/qualified sports coaches
- making sure that staff have access to training opportunities & CPD
- subsidising transport in order to support all families financially
- giving pupils opportunities to compete in sporting events with other schools
