

Pupil Premium – Allocation, use and impact.

Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months.

We are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

How do we identify pupils at St Benedict's Catholic School?

We use rigorous monitoring procedures of both teaching and learning to ensure that we meet the needs of all pupils. Those who are considered to be vulnerable or socially disadvantaged are effectively assessed and supported so that their needs are addressed as part of the provision we make through the Pupil Premium.

Our provision also recognises that not all pupils identified as Ever 6, LAC or Adopted Children will be socially disadvantaged. Equally, not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered as Ever 6, LAC or Adopted Children. Therefore, our Pupil Premium funding is allocated for individuals and groups of pupils identified as:

- Socially disadvantaged and/or eligible as FSM/LAC/Adopted/Service children.
- Vulnerable and at risk of underachievement.
- Having been identified with specific learning or complex needs.
- Subject to a child in need plan or child protection plan.

Financial year 2016 - 2017.

St. Benedict's Catholic Primary School received £1300.00 per Ever six and Free School meals pupils and £1900 for Looked after Children.

In total we received £ 29,479.97 in respect of 17 pupils who qualified for the Pupil Premium.

Amount PPG received per LAC or post LAC pupil - £1900
