

English

This term, our fiction text is *Where the Wild Things Are*. We will be exploring settings and using adjectives to make our writing exciting. We will also be developing our performance skills through performing poetry in groups. We will conclude by writing our own stories about going on a journey, using our learning to support our writing.

Maths

This term, we consolidate our understanding of addition and subtraction, and use our skills to help us solve mathematical problems. We will also develop our place value skills to begin to partition numbers. Towards the end of the term, we will begin to learn counting in 2s, 5s and 10s!

RE

Computing

This term, we will be continuing to focus on creating and storing data in appropriate ways. We will sort and group pictures into pictograms, tallies and tables.

Science

This term, we will be continuing our learning all about everyday materials. The children will have experience of identifying and grouping materials. We will also develop our 'working scientifically' skills by testing materials fairly and representing our findings in a scientific way.

Thematic Curriculum (History, Geography, DT)

Our topic will start with a wow day, where children will create their own adventure stories, learn sea shanties and make their own treasure island. Through our topic, children will find out about the pirate Blackbeard and be able to use different sources to find out information about his life. In geography, they will use maps to identify the continents and oceans in our world as well as use simple compass directions to show where places are.

Health and Well-Being (Art, Music, Sport)

In sport, the children will be exploring gymnastics. They will also continue to develop their fundamental movement skills through the use of Real PE.

In art, sculptor Miguel Rotchschild and architect Jean Gang provide Year 1's inspiration for underwater art looking at the water's surface and hidden treasures beneath.

In music, the children will explore pitch, tempo, timbre and texture to compose simple pieces of music that reflects their changing mood.
