

Sports Premium

The Government has given every Primary School funding to develop Physical Education and competitive sport. The funding will be used to develop the teachers' skills and their delivery of lessons as well as enabling children to take part in a wide range of competitions with other schools.

We believe that providing children with a broad and balanced PE curriculum will motivate them to lead healthy lifestyles.

The funding will allow specialist coaches to work alongside members of staff to teach children the required skills leading them to become more confident and competent in all areas of PE.

We have been awarded £18,270 for 2018-19 and we are using the money to:

Sports Premium 2017/2018

PE has a high profile in our school and the impact of the Sports Premium Grant has allowed us to continue to improve the access and delivery for all our children.

The table below demonstrates the impact of spending the 2017-18 grant:

Holmfirth Pennine Partnership	£1,504	As we are part of the Pennine Sports Partnership (PSP) we are able to access the facilities of Honley High School. Cricket sessions	£150	These sessions enabled children to develop their skills at cricket. They were given the opportunity to play games, learn the skill and understand the importance of working as a team. Children were encouraged to push themselves.
CDP Training	£1,000	Staff went on courses to develop their skills in PE. PE co-ordinator went on a course to help with understanding how to develop the subject within school. 2 ETA's went on a course for movement skills to develop movement group run in mornings at school.
Maths of the day	£475	Maths of the day has been used to encourage children to take part in PE within other areas of the curriculum. Children have been running, skipping or jogging whilst developing their maths skills too. Staff have enjoyed using this within the classroom and it has had a super impact on learning.

Netball hoops for the Ball Court	£1,857	Netball hoops were added in the ball court to be used within PE lessons, before and after school as well as for an after-school club run by a member of staff.
Fixed Exercise Equipment	£9,945	Equipment was placed within the playground for children to increase their fitness levels. These can be used at breaktime, lunchtime and before/after school. They have increased fitness levels and work well with the 1k run.
Wall Mounted PE Equipment	£3,339	This equipment in the hall has developed children's skills. The equipment has been used within indoor pe and within after-school gymnastic clubs.
