
Half Term 2 (2018-2019)

The SIXTH book in the hilarious series from the creator of Captain Underpants!



Clarry and her older brother Peter live for their summers in Cornwall, staying with their grandparents and running free with their charismatic cousin, Rupert.


Non-fiction Recommendations
