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Purpose

At Eldwick Primary School we believe that having a welcoming and vibrant learning environment supports pupils in their learning. Displays are an effective way of sharing learning as well as celebrating pupil achievement and providing learning support.

Classroom Environment

The learning environment influences the learning ethos that happens within it. It is important that classrooms are: organised, tidy and resources clearly labelled so that pupils and adults working in the class can access them easily and can move around the environment safely. The classroom displays should set a good example in presentation. The learning environment should be welcoming and should cater for all learners and their individual learning needs.

All classroom will be free of clutter and include the following:

- Visual timetable of the school day
- Topic display (including Knowledge Organiser)
- Clearly labelled accessible resources

Teachers will ensure that displays are clearly labelled and are well presented to provide good examples to our pupils about presentation skills.

Zone Environment

All zones will include the following:

- Reading area which is inviting and focused
- British Values and SMSC (spiritual, moral, social and cultural development)
- Work of the week
- Science display
- Reading display

School Displays

School Leaders, HLTAs and class teachers will also be responsible for displays around the school. The member of staff and display content will be agreed at the start of the school year and updated termly. Maths 'stickers' will identify maths within each display.
