The above chocolate bars and sweets have been found in children's lunch boxes this week. These are not allowed for consumption in school as part of a child's snack or lunch during the school day. They do not follow school policy as they contain too much sugar. Any child with these at school will be asked to take them home and not be allowed to eat them. Children will be given a piece of fruit to eat instead. As a school we have a duty of care to our children

September 2016, Universal Free School meals were introduced to all Key Stage one children. This is a FREE school dinner for every child aged 4-7 in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This has saved a lot of time and money for so many families but **16** children do not take up this offer which could save families over **£500 per year**, we urge our families to take up this wonderful offer! Most children seem to really enjoy the variety that a school meal offers, but unfortunately a school meal doesn't work for every child. Our school meals are cooked on site by Leeds City Council and follow the School Food Standards - Section 114A School Standards and Framework Act 1998 requires that food and drink provided to pupils at schools in England complies with certain nutritional standards. Please see our Food Policy on our school website.

Schools are allowed to set their own policies regarding the types of food consumed on their premises during the school day and, provided that the policies implemented by the schools do not breach the school's obligations under the Equality Act 2010 or any other relevant legislation, schools are free to determine what their pupils bring to school to eat during the day and, if their policies allow, to confiscate or challenge the inclusion of prohibited items within packed lunches.


At the fayre, we also said congratulations to Miss K Walker, our very own Miss Christmas, whose boyfriend proposed to her after the choir had sung!
