

English

The children will be using Talk4Writing to write narrative poems and to create a narrative story based on the three little pigs and similar stories. The children will be consolidating suffix and prefixes as well as identify features of sentences and key grammar vocabulary. They will use their phonic knowledge to develop their spellings. In guided reading the children will focus on the picture book, the Day the Crayons Quit by Oliver Jeffers to develop their inference skills.



History

The children will compare old and new buildings, exploring homes through time. They will look at how buildings have changed through time comparing a modern day home or apartment to a Roman or Victorian home. What are the similarities and differences? What materials have been used over time to create these buildings?



Mathematics

The children will recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, including recognising odd and even numbers. Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts. During statistics children will interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables and ask and answer simple questions by counting the number of objects in each category and sorting the categories by quantity. During shape they will use mathematical names for common 3-D and 2-D shapes, describe their properties and understand positional language.

Science

The children will identify and discuss the uses of different everyday materials so that they become familiar with how some materials are used for more than one thing. They will think about the properties of materials that make them suitable or unsuitable for particular purposes and they should be encouraged to think about unusual and creative uses for everyday materials. They will work scientifically by: comparing the uses of everyday materials in and around the school with materials found in other places observing closely, identifying and classifying the uses of different materials, and recording their observations. They will link science to their forest school experiences, creating mud bricks, and straw huts and stick houses.



RE

The children will explore the Hindu celebration of Raksha Bandhan. The focus is on how people's beliefs are expressed in celebrations and the importance of family in religions.

Computing

The children will discuss and explore e-safety and how to be safe in the world of technology.

They will also look at basic operating software such as word, excel and publisher.

PE / Games

The children will develop their basic gymnastic skills looking at balance, shape, position, how to travel, and move. They will combine these skills to create simple routines. Using a range of large and small equipment.



Art /DT

In Art the children will explore buildings and their materials. Using key skills to create detailed buildings of their own. They will look at the architecture of Gaudi and other designs from around the world and the famous buildings they have created.

During DT the children will design and make a chair, strong enough to hold one of the three little pigs!

PSHE

Healthy Lifestyles : The children will discuss and recognise what they like and dislike, how to make real, informed choices that improve their physical and emotional health, to recognise that choices can have good and not so good consequences.
