

Maths

We will begin the half term by developing our formal methods for \times and \div operations. This will include using the 'bus stop' method to solve division problems with remainders. We will use these skills to solve a range of problems in real life contexts.

We will then begin to learn more about fractions.

Year 5 will also continue to work extremely hard in mental maths groups, Times Tables Rock stars and arithmetic quizzes!

Science

'Forces' is our topic this half term. As usual, we will carry out lots of exciting practical investigations! We will investigate the principles of gravity, air resistance, water resistance and balanced forces.

We will continue to develop our scientific enquiry skills by thinking about factors we need to change or keep the same in our investigations, to ensure we test fairly.

Humanities

We will learn about Ancient Egypt! Children will begin by learning about chronology in BC times. They will research Gods, understand the importance of pharaohs, including the famous 'boy pharaoh' and become expert embalmers!

Year 5 will also discover lots of facts about the River Nile and its impact on surrounding land. We will celebrate our learning with an exciting Egyptian day!

P.E.

This half term PE will be on Thursdays and Mondays.

On a Thursday, children will continue to develop their gymnastics skills with Beth, our specialist teacher.

On Mondays, we will focus on fitness and building up our stamina through a range of circuit training activities which will exercise the core, cardio, leg and arm muscles. Please note that children need a full PE kit in order to participate in PE.

Literacy

Year 5 will begin by studying a range of fascinating Ancient Egyptian myths. Children will have opportunities to learn about these myths in a variety of forms, and then write and share their own mythical narratives.

Children will also become researchers and journalists to write their own newspaper reports about famous Egyptian discoveries.

Children will learn about parenthesis while continuing to secure their spelling knowledge.

Religion

Our topic this half term is 'Inspirational People'.
