

Important Information regarding school meals

From the **1**st **January 2019** the cost of a two course school lunch will be **£1.80** for **Years 3, 4, 5** and **6**. Universal Free School Meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are still free of charge.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

We constantly strive to be an outstanding school and to do this we have to be outstanding in all areas, which include attendance, uniform and punctuality. Please can I remind you of the important details in our **Home School Agreement** - which is signed by you and your child:

• I/we will make sure my child attends school punctually each day.

Classroom doors open at 8.50am and the children are expected to be sat at their desks ready to start work no later than 9.00am. The school gates are locked precisely at 9am. Any child arriving after this time will be marked in the register as late. The Government has changed legislation to include the following:

Any child that is late 10 times or more in a school term (approx. 3 months) can be fined £60 per child, which rises to £120 if not paid within 21 days.

As lateness seems to be a problem with a small number of children, school will now be monitoring this more closely - in line with the above.

- I/we will inform the school on the first day of any absence before 9.00 am.
- I/we will ensure that regular, planned, expected medical appointments are made outside of school time.

If this is unavoidable please make sure school is notified well in advance and not on the day of the appointment.

- I/we will ensure that family holidays are booked during school holidays.
 EXCEPTIONAL circumstances should be discussed with the Head of School following the completion of the holiday request form.
 Attendance will continue to be closely monitored and the Government Supreme High Court has ruled that holidays cannot be taken during term time and school has the right to fine parents if they do.
- I/we will make sure that my child is properly presented for school by ensuring:
 - my child is wearing the correct uniform (labelled). My daughter is wearing black or red tights or white socks and not leggings.
 - my child has an appropriate hairstyle (NO shaved tramlines, colouring, undercuts or half shaved hairstyles).
 - my child is not wearing make-up or jewellery to school (small stud earrings are acceptable but should not be worn in school during the day they have PE lessons/swimming).

Girls Winter Uniform: Red cardigan, royal blue pinafore or skirt, light blue blouse, red tie, red or black tights/white socks and black shoes.

Boys Winter Uniform: Grey trousers, pale blue shirt, red tie, royal blue V neck jumper and black shoes.

No trainers or sweatshirts.

Our school uniform is import to us. It is one way we identify ourselves as a school family. Smartness and high standards of appearance are expected at all times.
