| ELSA – Emotional Literacy Support Assistants | £2200                       | Weekly   | <p>At times children can struggle with managing their feelings and emotions. This can impact on their learning in the classroom.</p> <p>ELSA is offered to children who need support managing social, emotional and mental health needs. This supports them with accessing learning in the classroom. It also promotes their wellbeing and allows them to work on managing feelings and emotions. It also provides children with strategies to use outside of the ELSA sessions.</p> <p><b>This action will result in children being supported in achieving at least expected standard in their year groups and making at least good progress.</b></p> |                  |
| Chat 'n' Chill                               | £1800                       | Daily    | <p>During unstructured times of the day some children may need support and advice in managing social situations.</p> <p>During Chat 'n' Chill Teaching Assistants are available throughout the lunch hour to reinforce positive play and discuss strategies and ways to manage social situations as they arise.</p> <p><b>This action will result in a prompt start to the afternoon lessons, ensuring maximum learning time plus happy and content children.</b></p>  |                  |
| Pupil Premium Dedicated Intervention Time    | £1200                       | Weekly   | <p>We aim to identify individual barriers for the Pupil Premium children and target specific support to ensure their social, emotional and learning needs are fully met.</p> <p>Each Pupil Premium child meets with their allocated Pupil Premium Teaching Assistant on a weekly basis. During this time the children with take part in activities tailored to their individual needs such as</p>  |                  |

| Teacher time in class | £2400   | Daily | <p>Pupil Premium children need Quality First Teaching from our teachers, allocating a specific amount of teacher time per day to these children.</p> <p>The teacher spends an allocated amount time with the Pupil Premium children whilst the Teaching Assistant works with the rest of the class.</p> <p><b>This action will ensure that Pupil Premium children have in the moment quality feedback, giving accurate next steps and ensuring a footprint in apparent in their books. This will support children in achieving at least age related expectations in their year group.</b></p> |  |
| Interventions         | £17,600 | Daily | <p>Children need to reach secure standard with the class learning objectives taught on a daily basis. Same and next day interventions are used to support children in achieving each objective.</p> <p>Teaching Assistants are released to carry interventions based on the class learning objectives and gaps in learning.</p> <p><b>This action will promote accelerated progress and increase the percentage of children achieving expected and greater depth standard.</b></p>  |  |
| Breakfast Club        | £1500   | Daily | <p>Research shows that children need a healthy breakfast in order to have a positive start to the day which will help them to maintain concentration in the classroom.</p> <p>Money is set aside for children with Pupil Premium to access Breakfast</p>  |  |

| After School Clubs       | £2900 | Weekly              | <p>It is important to give children the opportunity to access a range of enrichment activities to improve their experiences and develop life skills.</p> <p>Teaching Assistants offer clubs after school and within the dinner hour that provide enrichment such as Gardening, Cooking, Recorders, Reading and Singing.</p> <p><b>This action will provide opportunities that will foster the development of the whole child and create memorable experiences whilst developing skills.</b></p>   |  |
| Enrichment Opportunities | £2000 | One off days        | <p>A barrier to some children's development is lack of opportunity to access a wide range of experiences to put their learning into context.</p> <p>Throughout the year we organise a range of visitors across different subjects to come into school and work with the children, sharing their expert knowledge. This covers a range of experiences from Change 4 life drama productions, history specialists with artefacts, people from different religious faiths and music concerts.</p> <p><b>This action will support the development of the whole child and support them in making links and connections between classroom learning and real-life events. It will also encourage children to have aspirations for their future.</b></p> |  |
| School Trips             | £800  | One off experiences | <p>Children do not always have equal opportunity to take part in enrichment activities outside of school.</p>   |  |

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|                    |      |                                      | <p>Further enrichment opportunities are arranged for children that involve leaving the school site and taking part in memorable experiences through school trips. In order for these trips to be provided including the end of year residential for Year 6, school subsidises the cost for all trips and also covers the full cost for some Pupil Premium children in order for them to have equal access.</p> <p><b>This action will impact children's academic progress through making real life links to their learning and it will have a positive impact on their social and emotional development.</b></p> |  |
| Heartsmart Toolkit | £400 | One off cost for yearly subscription | <p>It is important for children to develop their wellbeing through having sessions focused on feelings and emotions that will support them with real-life situations.</p> <p>Heartsmart is a toolkit of resources that teachers can use which offer lesson resources that cover current and update topics that link to children's mental health and wellbeing.</p> <p><b>This action will ensure happy and confident children who are growing into good people that can make a difference in the wider world.</b></p>  |  |
