This Half Term we will be learning about:

For the first two weeks of January we will be focussing on **Winter**, encouraging the children to think about seasonal weather patterns, looking at animals that live in cold climates and investigating melting and freezing.

Our second focus for this half term will be **When I Grow Up I Want To Be...** a topic based around people and occupations. We will be learning about different jobs that people do through the use of non-fiction books, small-world play and role-play scenarios and, hopefully, visitors (see 'how can you help' below!).

How Can You Help?

- We try to spend time outdoors each day so please could you help your child by practising putting on and fastening their coats - this would save us a lot of time!
- Please ensure that your child has a change of clothes (winter wear) in their pump bag, to change into if necessary.
- Snowshakers...Please could all children bring a small, clear plastic bottle (with lid) to make a snowshaker.
- If anyone would be willing to come and talk about the job that they do to the children please come and have a chat to a member of staff. Previously we have had visits from the police and fire services, vets, nurses, cake makers and builders...can you help?

Snack Money.
