	<p>Emergency</p> <p>Learn your address and practise what you would say if you were ever in an emergency and had to call 999.</p>	<p>Animal Books</p> <p>Find some books about animals. Read them and write a book review on one. Write some sentences on what you liked about the book.</p>	<p>Living things</p> <p>Go for a walk with a grown up around a garden or park. Look carefully to see what plants and flowers you can see growing. You could take some photos or draw some pictures of the things you see.</p>	<p>Shape Hunt</p> <p>Go on a hunt for 3D shapes. Write or draw the objects you have found.</p>
	<p>Symmetry</p> <p>Butterflies have symmetrical wings – this means their wings are the same on both sides. Try making your own symmetrical shapes by folding a piece of paper in half and cutting out some pieces. When you open it out it will be a symmetrical shape. You could also decorate it to be symmetrical too.</p>	<p>Model Vehicle</p> <p>Create your own emergency vehicle. Think about its features – sirens, hosepipes and ladders, bright colours. You could make your vehicle out of old boxes, bottle top lids and cardboard tubes.</p>	<p>Chinese New Year</p> <p>Make a model dragon – you could use cardboard tubes and boxes, play dough, construction toys or natural materials like leaves and pebbles. Maybe you could draw a picture or take a photo of your dragon model.</p>	<p>Easter</p> <p>People often celebrate Easter by eating chocolate or buns and cakes. Try making a sweet treat to share with your family. We would love to see a photo or picture of any treats you make.</p>
	<p>Seeds</p> <p>Try growing some plants or flowers at home. You could try planting some seeds in a pot or in your garden. Remember to give your seeds some water and put them somewhere sunny. Cress seeds grow quite quickly or you could try to see how high you can grow a sunflower.</p>	<p>Measuring</p> <p>Find some different sized spoons in your house. Can you order them from biggest to smallest? Take a picture and stick it in your homework book.</p>	<p>Spring Babies</p> <p>During spring, lots of animals have their babies. Find out the names of these baby animals: duck, pig, sheep, cow, rabbit and horse.</p>	<p>People Who Help Us</p> <p>Draw a picture of a person who has helped you in the last few weeks. Write some short sentences to describe what they did.</p>
