

Create a meal that would provide the essential energy required for a mountain hike. Or why not make a fruit and nut energy bar? Bring it in for us to taste (if nut free) or take a photo and ask your friends and family to comment on your creation.



Travel Brochure

Design a tourist information poster about one of the world's tallest mountains, aiming to persuade people to visit on a mountaineering holiday. Make it look exciting and colourful so that people will want to visit!



Mountain Design

Make your very own mountain in whichever form you wish; it may be a papier-mâché model, a mountain cake or biscuits or even something you have created using fabric. Give your mountain a name and make a list of all the other interesting facts about it!

Create a tally chart of the most used electrical items in your house by you and your family over one day. Create a bar chart with your data. Challenge- can you create line graph showing when the most electrical items are being used at once during the day?



Inventor!

Design an invention which uses an electrical system, and build a model of your invention. Plan an oral presentation to show the class how it works. (Your model doesn't need to actually have an electrical circuit inside it, only your design).




Green Challenge
