Dear Parents/ Guardians,

It has been lovely to have the children back at school this week. They have been full of news about the holiday which they have been sharing with each other. One of our first tasks was to write about the holidays, some of the children are now able to attempt independent sentences and others shared the writing with the teacher as modelled sentences, an important part of the early writing process.

This week the children have learnt about the North (Arctic) and South Poles (Antarctic) in preparation for the Topic Launch on Monday. They have looked at the locations of these places and have thought about the clothes that they would need to take with them on their holidays. All children have been given a passport and their ticket in readiness for boarding the plane. Some of the children have written lists for the things that they will need to take. Please do remember that very warm clothes will be needed on Monday (14th January), they do not need to wear uniforms but do need hats, scarves, gloves, thick jumpers, all in ones (if they have them), jackets and anything else that you feel is needed to be worn for outdoor activities for most of the day.

- Please do read with your child weekly - little and often is best and help us by recording what they have done at home in their reading record. If you are unsure please do speak to your child's class teacher.
