

Year 2 and 3 Curriculum Spring 2019

Please find below the plan of what we will be covering in class this term:

Literacy - Literacy this term will be themed around our topic of Stone Age to Iron Age. We will read the books 'The Stone Age Boy' and 'Ug' and use these to stimulate different types of writing including letters, invitations and information booklets.

Maths - This term children will continue to learn strategies and methods to assist with mental and written calculations of number. Children will also be learning about fractions, number problems, shapes, position and direction and time.

R.E. - Our topic at the start of the term will focus on how beliefs are expressed through the arts. Later on in the term we will look at how Christians celebrate Easter.

Science - This term our topic is 'Rocks, Soils and Fossils'. Children will discover the different types of rocks and how they are formed. They will compare and group rocks based on appearance and simple properties. Children will understand how soil is formed and investigate the permeability of different types of soil.

Topic - Our topic this term is 'Stone Age to Iron Age'. Children will learn about how early man survived in a harsh environment, why Skara Brae was important for understanding life in the Stone Age, how copper mining was crucial to the Bronze Age and why Stonehenge was built. Children will also learn about why Iron Age people developed hillforts.

Art and Design and Technology - Children will be creating their own Stone Age cave art. They will design, build and evaluate their own Stone Age houses.

Computing - As well as computing skills being taught discretely within other subjects, children will use coding using scratch.

PSCHE - This term we will look at our relationships and ways of coping with change.

PE - Each week, a sports specialist will be teaching the children PE. They will also be taking part in dance sessions with a dance specialist.

MUSIC - Children will continue to develop in Music by working on their listening and observational skills, singing and team playing. Children will work on developing their fine motor skills whilst playing recorders and penny whistles.
