Robins' Drumming

On Thursday afternoon we were treated to a superb performance of Djembe drumming from Robins' class, who have been learning with Mr Bateman from NMPAT (Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust) for the past 10 weeks.

They have learnt about dynamics, tempo and pitch through games, songs and drumming rhythms, and it was great to see how much they have progressed in the time that they have been learning.



Peace Worship

Kestrels' class shared their thoughts about our Christian value of peace in a values worship on Wednesday morning. They explained what different symbols of peace mean, and told the story of Sadaki Sasako, a Japanese school girl who lived in Hiroshima when the atomic bomb was dropped to end World War 2. Sadly, she later died from Leukaemia as a result of the radiation from the bomb, but whilst she was ill she began making paper cranes out of origami, because a belief in Japan is that if you make 1000 paper cranes you are granted one wish – her wish was to get better, and for a world without nuclear weapons. After her death a monument was built in the Hiroshima Peace Garden to commemorate Sadako and thousands like her.
