Pupil Premium Funding 2017 - 18

Total Allocation – £99,000

Our IDSR (2018) shows that the children who are entitled to Pupil Premium – disadvantaged pupils, Free School Meals children make good progress. The school has used Pupil Premium effectively to close the gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupils.

Progress for disadvantage pupils in KS2 is in the top 20% in Writing and Mathematics (Q1) and in the top 40% (Q2) for Reading, all being significantly above national.
