2017/18 How it made a difference to pupils' attainment and progress

At Woodland Grange we have high expectations for all our pupils. We measure progress and attainment in a combination of ways. We can compare eligible pupils with non-eligible pupils in a summative way as they travel through the school. We can also compare termly pupil assessments in reading, grammar and punctuation and maths. Progress of entitled pupils is tracked across their time at school. This information can be monitored by staff and school governors (specifically the governor with responsibility for these pupils).

We also measure progress against specific targets set as part of their pupil premium intervention at school. These provide a valuable source of evidence as they focus on specific, individualised areas for that pupil. We passionately believe in the role that parents can play in supporting and enhancing the learning of their children. We set the expectation with staff working with entitled pupils of even greater communication between school and home in order to maximise learning gains. Parents should be fully aware of intervention programmes and regular meetings are held with parents to fully understand the targets that are set.
