

**Governor Sports and Physical Education Impact Report
Autumn Term 2018 - 2019**

After yet another outstanding year of Sport at St John's we continue to re-evaluate the impact of the sports premium and how we can once again raise the bar for sport at St John's.

After-school Clubs

Our focus is once again to try and raise attendance levels in after-school clubs and competitions. Using our tracking system, updated every half term, we continue to be able to track those children who are attending both after-school clubs and competitions. As in previous years, we reduce the number of spaces available online and complete personal invites to each year group. The focus of this was to allow opportunities for those who had not been to a club, in previous years, to attend one and encourage equal opportunities for all children to attend, including boys, girls, pupil premium, services and SEN.

As well as a focus on our pupil premium, service and SEN children we once again maintain our commitment to supporting our young carers through after school opportunities.

This year I have also ensured that sport and P.E. provision has addressed the needs of those gifted groups of children. I have also talked with many parents and carers about how to support their children in developing their talents and passion in sports further. It has been wonderful to hear of so many children that have joined outside sports clubs including Football and Hockey Clubs.

The above table shows us the key areas that we need to focus on over the next term to raise attendance levels for clubs. A key area is again SEN and Pupil Premium but also a drop in KS1 children attending clubs. Children will once again be invited to attend clubs in January.

I have looked closely at the key areas that need targeting over the remainder of the year. Pupil Premium in both Key Stages has been low. Year 1 girl's attendance has dropped from last year as has year 3 boys. Year 2 attendance including SEN children will be investigated as this has dropped slightly. KS1 Multi-sports has been capped so parents can only apply for 1 club per long term. For example, Multisport Term 1 or Term 2, not both. This then gives other families the opportunity to sign up.

Girls in KS2 is another area that I am looking at and whether a girls only club would help draw in some of those who are reluctant to sign up. We offer different clubs each term as some children prefer some sports to others. Invites for clubs will once again be sent to children to join clubs based on the findings above. Sports leaders who help with clubs will in future start to promote clubs in an assembly and I am looking at whole year group afterschool multisport events for the summer term with help from teachers and TA's.

Competitions

So far this autumn term we have taken part in 7 competitions, 4 Community events and 3 Cokethorpe events.

Our success in Cross Country this year has been noticeable with all children taking part in competitions being able to finish the course and the majority of children finishing within the top 30 places in races of up to 90 children, many from independent schools. This shows that the fitness levels of children at St John's is increasing as a result of the daily active offer in lessons but also in breaktimes and now before school. Grace Wilson (Year 6) surpassed her 2017, 10th place position to take 3rd place at this year's Cokethorpe event.

Our U9 football team missed out on qualifying for the county competition by one point after an amazing tournament at Carterton Community College. The Year 3 basketball teams made up of mainly Pupil Premium Children had a fun filled afternoon at the College and took home the 2nd place award.

The Year 4 children enjoyed a morning of dance at their annual Dance festival in November with their theme of exploring. Year 1,2 and 3 will all take part in whole year group festivals in the new year.

The above table shows the key areas to focus on to ensure a wider range of participation across the school. Competitions are mainly aimed at UKS2 children and we use the same tracking system for our Competitions as we do our clubs. By the end of term 6 we are hoping to have given all UKS2 children the opportunity to attend a competition.

Every child in the school has already completed an intra-competition and we are 100% for SEN, PP and Service Children at intra level.

A Term of Hockey

The standard of hockey at school has always been high but this term has been sensational.

We have once again reached the final of the Carterton Cup that will be played in January after a thrilling semi-final which saw our A team battle against our B team. The B team on paper were much stronger, however with an impressive team effort the B team took the victory after a very exciting penalty shootout.

The Year 6 girl's hockey competition at Cokethorpe School was incredible with many girls being recommended to join outside clubs and we finished the competition in 8th place. The Year 5 girls also achieved massive success at Cokethorpe and represented us superbly beating several teams including Cokethorpe themselves and finished the day in 4th place out of 9, the majority again being independent schools.

The biggest highlight of both tournaments was seeing the spirit in which our girls play with. Coming from a coaching role at Cokethorpe myself I know how much time goes into coaching the teams at the school and the children seem programmed to win, whereas our happy smiling children who battled on, speaking about our values and how the priority is enjoying the game and showing respect. They put the 100% effort into their play but they know why we do what we do. To have fun and enjoy the game. The results speak for themselves.

One SEN pupil has been reluctant to do PE during his time at St John's and I have been unable to assess him on anything however after personally designing him a Mine Craft themed PE lesson plan, together with his TA, were able to complete several activities and have finally been able to assess him on various tasks.

Girls Sport

KS2 Girls sport has been phenomenal over the last year and I have been so proud to see a lot of them join outside clubs. Their passion and drive for sport has been inspiring and I often talk to the rest of the school about how they are doing in sport. They are a delight to teach and show so much respect and team spirit when they play. I have taught them all since year 3 so have been delighted with their progression.

Attitudes to PE and School Sport

In a recent survey the children were asked if they enjoy PE and Sport at St John's

From the above table we can see that there are a small number of children that still do not enjoy PE. This is mainly those children that for some reason struggle still to access the lessons or have low self-esteem. These children have been identified and will be targeted over the remainder of the year to build confidence in their PE lessons and after school clubs.

Real PE Resource

In our Sports Funding Evaluation completed last year we identified a gap in scheme resources to further develop the range and quality of PE teaching. Having evaluated a range of materials and with support from Rachel Mills, our Sports Partnership coordinator we have purchased REAL PE by Create Development. The resource provides fun and simple to follow Primary PE Schemes of Work and support for Early Years Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 practitioners that give them the confidence and skills to deliver outstanding PE. It is fully aligned to the National Curriculum and Ofsted requirements and focuses on the development of agility, balance and coordination, healthy competition and cooperative learning through a unique and market leading approach to teaching and learning in PE.

Included in the resource is an online platform with teaching resources and videos and lesson plans and resources for each year group. Mr Hyatt has attended the first of three training days and will be working with teachers across the school over the Spring and Summer terms to implement the new ideas. In addition, as part of this scheme of work the teachers and teaching assistants in EYFS and Year 1 will receive training with the Create Development team next term. This will involve a trainer working with them to deliver and evaluate a PE session with their class.

Awards

We are extremely proud of sport here at St John's and have our tracking, data and evidence in place to achieve our fourth and final Gold award in a row. This fourth award will enable us to apply for the Platinum award in 2020. The Platinum Award was as an extension of the School Games Mark to reward schools who have maintained consistently high standards with their school sport provision.

In addition, we are applying for the 2017/18 sporting school of the year, however the date for nominations has now been postponed until later in the school year.
