Pupil Premium Grant Allocation – 2015-16

St. John's Pupil Premium Grant for 2014/15 was **£70,900**.

Pupil Premium allows us to target pupils eligible for free school meals and children in care to help them achieve their full potential.

As a school we have identified pupils and used the £70,900 to target additional support as follows:

- Staffing to Implement small-group interventions;
- Focussing on nurture and raising self-esteem programmes;
- Enabling individual and small group tuition in English and Maths across the school
- Resources to enable children to access all areas of the curriculum, support learning, improve attendance and increase participation in after school clubs
- Funding of all trips for children entitled to free school meals or ever 6 children

IMPACT

In 2014-15 the Year 6 cohort consisted of only 3 children in receipt of free school meals. The data shows that 100% achieved L4 in Reading, Writing & Maths and 100% made expected progress at the end of KS 2.

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St. John's Pupil Premium Grant for 2015/16 is **£79,200**.

Following an evaluation of the impact of the Pupil Premium Grant in 2014/15, we are working this year to target our funding to further accelerate this group of pupils and to increase the number of FSM children achieving level 5 at the end of Key Stage 2.

We intend to use this to raise achievement and narrow the gap through small group interventions and skills focus sessions by supporting the following:
