

In art, the children will:

- Describe and give their opinions on different types of street art.
- Find out about the work of Banksy and other graffiti artists
- Use mixed media to create their own street art.

In history, the children will:

- Learn about how criminals have been punished for their crimes from Roman times to modern day.
- Use a range of sources to explore the prevalence of different crimes during different periods of history.
- Explore the changing attitudes to punishment for criminals over history.

In literacy, the children will:

- Write a range of texts based on the theme linked to class texts.
- Read and respond to a range of texts, building on their vocabulary and developing their skills of inference
- Learn how to use the past perfect and present perfect tenses
- Use modal verbs to suggest possibility

In maths the children will:

- Consolidate their understanding of equivalent fractions
- Learn to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions
- Describe positions on the full coordinate grid (all four quadrants).
- Draw and translate simple shapes on the coordinate plane, and reflect them in the axes.



In PE, the children will:

 Take part in indoor athletics sessions, developing their skills in throwing, jumping and sprinting.

In RE, the children will:

- Learn what justice is and know that they are called to work for justice in the world.
- Learn about the prophet Elijah and John the Baptist as well as more modern day Christians like Oscar Romero.
- Explore the meaning of Advent and the customs associated with Advent and Christmas.
