

Pupil Premium Action Plan 2018-19

Pupil premium is additional funding provided to schools for supporting more disadvantaged pupils to ensure they benefit from the same opportunities as all other children. There are three categories of children that qualify for pupil premium:

- Children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM)
- Looked after children or adopted children
- Armed forces children

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit and pupils premium money is not allocated to be spent on individual children but to the advantage of all pupils who meet the criteria. Schools will be held accountable for how the additional funding to support pupils from low- income families is spent, they are expected to apply value for money principles to their spending and monitor the impact this spending has on the attainment and progress of identified children. St Aidan's Church of England Academy monitor the impact of any spending on a termly basis and this is reported at a full governing body meeting. A named governor has been identified to monitor pupil premium spending. We publish online information about how we have used the Premium.

Allocation of Pupil Premium for 2018 - 19 is £20, 060.

Barriers to future attainment

- Poor language skills
- Family circumstances including long term health issues.
- Undiagnosed SEN conditions
- Poor attitude to learning, a lack of motivation, lack of resilience and a fixed mindset
- Lack of parental confidence in supporting their child.
- Poor social skills, emotional development, low self esteem and self confidence.
- Medical needs
- Bereavement and its impact
- Quality of interventions at home and in school
