Nature of support to overcome barriers to learning 2017 -18

Additional support from TA for small group intervention, targeted pastoral support, targeted family support, speech and language interventions, extra sessions in nursery, attendance support, funded after school clubs and subsidised trips, physical literacy work.

Targeted support for High School transition - independent travel training, transition days, TA accompaniment to High School events.

Financial support for trips and clubs.

Curriculum focus PPG spending

Resources and support for key skills in literacy and numeracy – WRMH support, Stareway to Spelling, Beat Dyslexia work, pre teaching for confidence building, 1:1 interventions for speech and language – Time To Talk, Social Use of Language, Precision Teaching and Physical Literacy intervention.

Pastoral support – friendship groups, readiness for learning.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

All pupils are targeted to ensure that children keep pace with their learning.

Due to the nature of some of the children who have SEND there may not be the full expected 6 steps progress but progress will be identified via PIVATs or other suitable assessment tracking.

Targeted to achieve their school set targets in maths and English.

Pupils are ready to learn due to pastoral support in school – attendance remains good, and relationships are stronger with peers.

Basic skills knowledge is extended in all children.

Children are Secondary School ready.

All children have access to and are encouraged to partake in all extra-curricular experiences and enrichment activities.
