

## Sport Premium Funding Action Plan 2018-19

The Government has increased the Sports Premium Funding to support the development of sports in primary schools in the academic year 2018-19 to £19600. The Sport Premium Funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Schools have to spend the Sport Premium Funding on improving provision of PE and sport.

This means that the school should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that Hollingwood Primary already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, the funding could be used to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the [School Games, Futures Partnership & MAT Friendly Leagues](#)
- run sports activities with other schools
