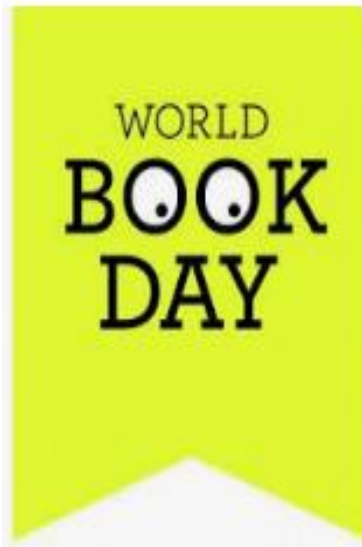

Autism and Transition to Secondary School

The move from primary to secondary school is both an exciting and challenging time for many young people and their parents. This is particularly true for pupils with autism. The aim of our training is help those young people to achieve a successful transition.

Our training will analyse the ways in which the four key areas of difference within autism have an impact on the move to secondary school, and where these differences may create particular problems. We will explain a number of practical strategies and tools that will support transition, both for use by school staff and by parents. We will also help participants to plan a preparation timeline for individual students.
