- Another busy week! On Monday James' mummy very kindly came in to lead some nature craft activities outdoors! Following our theme of Owls this week some children made their own owls out of tree bark - (you can see these on display on the shelves in the inner corridor - they are really interesting!). She also showed us how to make bird feeders with Cheerios and some children made wax-resist drawings of snowdrops or snowflakes using wax crayons and food colouring in water.

  She brought a special model that showed how our lungs work and a teddy bear who you could unzip to see inside he had intestines that we thought looked like sausages!
