



Charging and Remissions Policy September 2018 to August 2019

Issue	Policy
Educational Visits	<p>Parents are asked for a voluntary contribution to cover the costs of the visit including transport. The PTA will where possible subsidise the cost of visits. Children in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant will be funded for school visits.</p> <p>If the income for these visits does not meet the overall cost, such visits may have to be cancelled</p>
Residential Visits	<p>Parents are required to meet the full cost of the visit. Board and lodgings costs are reduced where pupils are in receipt of the Pupil Premium grant upon application to the Head teacher.</p> <p>If the income for these visits does not meet the overall cost, such visits may have to be cancelled.</p>
Activities outside School hours not within the National Curriculum	Parents are required to meet the full cost of such activities.
Milk Payments	<p>Parents are required to meet the full cost of any milk ordered for their child. Pupils eligible for Pupil Premium who wish to have milk beyond their 5th Birthday will be funded.</p> <p>NB. All children receive free milk until their 5th birthday.</p>
Music Tuition	<p>Where the school provides an 'outside' tutor, parents will be charged for the tuition.</p> <p>'Outside' tuition fees are reduced where pupils are in receipt of the Pupil Premium grant.</p>
Ingredients/Materials for Practical Subjects	<p>Parents are occasionally requested to provide materials for practical subjects, but no child will be disadvantaged because of parents' inability/reluctance to pay. Where necessary, school will pay the cost of this.</p>
Lost School Equipment books etc.	Parents may be requested to replace school equipment, books, etc. which have been lost by their child.
Breakages and damages to school buildings, furniture or property.	<p>Wilful damage to school buildings or property may be charged to parents by the school. (This also includes damage to the property of staff).</p>
