All children should complete at least one challenge over the term, but can do more than one challenge if they choose. Children will be awarded a raffle ticket for each challenge completed, which will be entered into a prize draw at the end of the term! The children will also receive SPAG and maths tasks each week. Maths tasks will be set on Mathletics on a **Friday** and will be due the following Friday. Spellings will be sent home on a Tuesday to be tested the following **Tuesday**. A raffle ticket will also be rewarded for each completed task - the more home learning completed, the better the chance of winning! Every child is expected to read at home daily and get at least three signatures in their reading record to show this. We are encouraging children to change their books independently at school.
