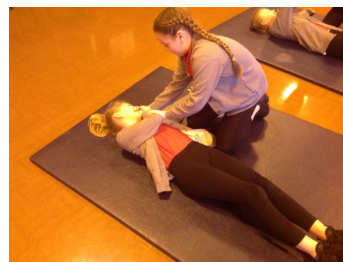
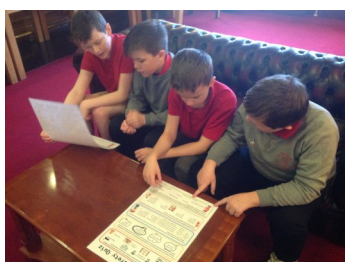
In Class 6 Literacy we will be continuing looking at non fiction work including: letter writing, diary writing, posters, persuasion work and non-chronological reports. New WILF checkers in writing have been sent home so that you can see the type of work we are expecting your child to include within their writing. The varying sentence types have been seen in children's writing and we will continue with this in Spring 2.

In Maths we will be looking at fractions, division, multiplication, data handling, shape, basic skills using the four rules (+ - x ÷) and problem solving. SAT preparation is well underway and we are really pleased with the basic skills children are already showing in the arithmetic test. New maths targets have been sent home so that you can see the area your child is working on this half term. Times Tables Rock Stars is also available for children to use at home in order to increase their times table knowledge and quick recall. Spag.com is to be used for Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation. Spelling shed is great for spelling interventions and helps greatly with patterns and rules.

In Religion we will be looking at Jesus, Son of God and Easter preparations. Our topic work is called "A Child's War" and it has a History focus - the children will be looking at why Britain is at war. We will also be going on our trip to Stockport Museum and Air Raid Shelters. This is a great trip and even better if the children dress up as an evacuee. In Geography, the children will be looking Cities in the UK.

In Computing the children will be developing their coding and programming skills further, using the Purple Mash software - this can also be accessed at home. In Design & Technology, the children will make a simple toy. In Music the children will be listening, performing and composing traditional wartime songs. The PE focus will be on Games skills and Gymnastics.
